

March is Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know that Colon Cancer is the third most common cancer in both men and women? Did you know that it is the second leading cause of cancer death in the US? But remarkably, it is the only cancer that can be prevented!

Our FaithHealth ministry is committed to good health as part of our stewardship to Christ. Many illnesses and diseases cannot be prevented, but Colon Cancer can! It is preventable, treatable, and beatable. The key is early detection and this is as simple as a colonoscopy. If you recognize that good health is a gift from God and as a Christian you have a responsibility to keep your body as healthy as possible, then you will have a colonoscopy when you reach the age of 50. A colonoscopy has saved many lives, including your pastor's life.

Everyone should have a colonoscopy at the age of 50, but you need to have one earlier if there is a family history of Colon Cancer or pre-cancerous polyps. If you experience blood in your stools, iron deficiency anemia, weight loss without dieting, rectal bleeding or abdominal pain you need to see your doctor ASAP and a colonoscopy may be necessary. Colonoscopies essentially allow you to stop colon cancer before it even starts.
