FINANCIAL UPDATE

Our 2017 projected budget was \$717,493.00. Our actual revenue was \$703,576.85, leaving us \$13,916.15 behind our goal. However, we were able to keep our expenses lower than projected which means that we ended up with a surplus of \$23,918.40. The surplus funds were distributed into various restricted accounts within the church budget. Our 2018 projected budget is 717,837.00. In January, our revenue was \$41,734.67 and our expenses were \$50,734.47. That leaves us 8,999.80 short of our projected budget through the first month of the year. Our Endowment Balance is \$1,705,445.91. We continue to see positive growth with our endowment funds. Please continue to be faithful with your financial commitments to the church.
