MARTHA BEST CHILDREN'S CENTER

The Martha Best Children's Center is doing well in caring for children of our community during the Spring months. The Center is at full enrollment in all classes and programs. We maintain a waiting list of children who would like to attend MBCC. Enrollment for our summer programs and for daycare service in the Fall of 2024 is underway. Graduation and promotion ceremonies for our children are being planned for early June.

A potential candidate to fill the open Director's position has been identified. It is hoped a new Director will be hired very soon. All teaching positions and assistant positions are filled. The Assistant Director's position is currently open. We are always looking to fill positions of substitutes and floaters to supplement our staff.

Playground equipment that had been purchased during the pandemic has arrived and has been installed. Some landscaping concerns will soon be addressed to finalize the renovations in the playground. All of this work was paid with grant money.

MBCC recently passed its latest State Rules Compliance Inspection and semi-annual Sanitation Inspection with no difficulty and no infractions.

MBCC is very thankful for our "Transition Leadership Team" as they provide leadership and administration for the center on a day to day basis. This team has volunteered their service as we have searched for a new director. Thanks go out to Jean Ashley, Julia Dunn and Eryn Myers for what they do for MBCC and our church.
