THE DRAGONFLY HOUSE

Parker Miller, Community Outreach Advocate for The Dragonfly House (CAC-Child Advocacy Center) spoke to The Carolyn Phillips Missions Group in October. She made us aware of what a CAC does as well as mandatory laws requiring suspected child abuse or neglect to be reported to DSS or Law Enforcement. The Dragonfly House is a nonprofit Children's Advocacy Center, located in Mocksville. NC. We are made up of a multidisciplinary team, including Davidson and Davie County Sheriff's offices, Davidson/Davie DSS, Lexington Police Department, Davidson/Davie DA's Office and Davie/Davidson School Districts. Our on site team is made up of victim advocates, trauma informed mental health counselors, a medical provider, a nurse, and a forensic interviewer. We have services including forensic interviews, child abuse medical exams, victim advocacy, trauma focused mental health treatment and community outreach education. All together we work to offer hope and healing to victims of child abuse. appointments, we provide each child a t-shirt, blanket and snacks. If anyone is interested in donating to our agency, we recommend mini water bottles, yoohoo chocolate milk, juice boxes and individually wrapped snacks. T Shirts can be youth to adult sizes. We appreciate monetary donations as well. Primarily, we want to educate and remind each person (18 +) of mandatory reporting laws. If you see something, say something!
